After her talk, there will be opportunities for Q&A, as usual.



Book Club News and Reviews December 2022 DCPBK Book Club Meeting:

On January 5th, eight members gathered to discuss the classic *The Bridge Over San Luis Rey* by Thornton Wilder. Much of the group shared a sense of confusion and disappointment, not quite "getting" the book for what it was acclaimed to be, but we had an important discussion about the historical context of works of literature and how that affects how we read it today. It is a classic grappling of "why do innocent people die" as a catholic friar works to justify why five folks in Lima, Peru were on the bridge when it fell. It gives a haunting



insight of the Spanish Inquisition as well as detailed personal struggles of the characters. Overall it is a good piece of writing, but we recommend if you want to read Wilder, start with *Our Town*.
